# TRIP REPORTS

## CANNING STOCK ROUTE TRIP- NEWSLETTER # 1

Graham and I set out from Oxley on Tuesday 3rd July 2018. An overnight stay at Murray Downs Resort just across the border from Swan Hill. We were amazed to see cotton growing and being harvested between Kerang and Swan Hill!

The next day in Renmark we replenished our fruit and vegetable supplies then met up with Chris and Neville Sonego as planned. A great evening meal out on the River Boat Thai Restaurant with Neville's cousin Mick and his wife Di.

### **STAGE 1 Renmark to Alice Springs**

#### **Day 1 - Thursday 5th July**

We left Remark and travelled north east to Danggali Conservation Park. The sandy track was in excellent condition – a practise run for the CSR. Drove through the park to Morgan Vale where we found an early camping spot in the scrub. Took us some time to get sorted for our first night under canvas! Cooked and spent some time around our first campfire. Spent a windy night in the rooftop and woke to a cool dry morning.

**Day 2** - We drove north to Yunta through some fabulous undulating country - blue saltbush, quandong trees and larger trees in water ways. We saw goats, sheep, cows and emus along the way. The wind was in our favour as it blew the dust from the track for the following vehicle. Yunta was our first Telstra phone coverage so messages from home were attended to. From Yunta we took the dirt road north towards Frome Downs. 4.00pm saw us stop to camp at Claypan Swamp to enjoy another campfire.

**Day 3** -We sighted our first dingo trotting off the scrub to the dunes just shy of Frome Downs. Came across the Camel Man and had a chat – walks in crocs! Drove into Arkaroola for a look and drove out again. Been there many years ago and it is very dry, dusty and dirty! Stayed the night in a donga at Lyndhurst. Our first bitumen road since leaving the outskirts north of Renmark! Our first showers followed up by a pub meal and chatting with fellow travellers was most welcome.

**Day 4** saw the bitumen run out as soon as we were out of Lyndhurst. 9.00am arrived in Farina and bought a delicious loaf of bread baked in the restored underground bakery. Their pasties were good too! The Friends of Farina are doing a power of voluntary work and are always looking for more interested in lending a helping hand.



Smoko was had at Maree where we bumped into Wangaratta-ites Ray & Rhonda Stamp, Clive Jones and Graham Whitehead and his brother. We are staggered by the amount of traffic (school holidays and Maree Camel Races yesterday). Another early camp on the Old Ghan line just short of Coward Springs. Plenty of firewood and a panoramic vista. Enjoyed a stunning red sunset.

**Day 5** saw us visit Beresford Siding then across the road to the hill where there are the remains of a Woomera Rocket Tracking station. We next explored Strangway Telegraph Station ruins – will be back. Fuelled up at William Creek - \$2 ltr. There are lots of roadworks and the track is like a highway. Camped on the Alge buckina Waterhole.

**Day 6** - arrived in Oodnadatta for smoko and stroll through the museum. Camped on the Stevenson River. The mornings have been cold but beautiful clear sunny days. Today we reached 18 degrees.

**Day 7** -Woke to another cold morning. Explored the ruins at Erlinga which is located on a magnificent waterhole, Abminga Siding and Telegraph Station on the Old Ghan Line and Charlotte Waters Telegraph Station. Crossed the border into Northern Territory and lunched on the dry Goyder River before entering Finke to get fuel – all closed. Camped the night at Lambert’s Geodetic Centre of Australia.

**Day 8** - saw us back in Finke and fuelled up (\$2.10 ltr). Destination is Old Andado which is set between red sand dunes lush with green cane grass. We were greeted by a dozen tagalong travellers stopped for lunch. Lucky for us they departed soon after to leave us to explore the old homestead, enjoy our second shower for the trip (donkey hot water service) and flush toilets! Chris and I enjoyed a walk to and along the red dune to our east while Graham and Neville started to cook our lamb camp roast!

**Day 9** – We awoke to another very cold morning. Visited Mac Clark's Peuce Acacia Reserve (700 year old acacias). 2.30pm pulled up to camp with the Train Range to our south east and about 30km south of Santa Teresa. Again, plenty of firewood for what is looking like another very cold night. Neville has discovered a fuel leak which will need to be looked at in Alice Springs. Went to bed clothed in trackies, socks, windcheaters and beanies! Day 10 (Saturday) woke to a ripper cold morning – water frozen. Drove into Alice Springs for fuel before heading south to camp at Chambers Pillar.

There are four other camps and we all enjoyed the 500 mtr walk to view the red sunset glow on the Pillar. A fairly stiff breeze resulted in a mild night.

**Day 11** dawned a much warmer morning, so it was a lazy breakfast around the campfire. Today was spent walking and climbing the steps to a lookout at the base of the Pillar. The supporting hand rail didn't go all the way and I didn't get much higher up before freezing (I don't like heights)! Chris was a few steps higher, so we sat and waited for the boys the help us back down. Spent the afternoon reading and relaxing before a camp oven roast beef. So good to spend two nights in camp!

**Day 12 Monday 16 July** packed up and headed into Alice Springs arriving lunch time. We had booked 3 cabins at the G'day Mate Caravan Park for next weekend when we will be joined by the Mahers. We shared an ensuite site on the first night then Graham and I managed to get a cabin for the rest of the week. So nice to have regular showers and not have to climb the ladder.

Can't recommend the G'day Mate people enough, the place is packed out!

Renmark to Alice Springs Travelled 2,283km from Renmark and less than 100km on bitumen – (2967km from home). Sandy, rocky, gravel, bull dust, dunes and steep jump up country – a great trial leading up to our Canning Stock Route adventure later in the month!

Used 345 litres diesel – lowest price \$1.489 Yunta, highest \$2.10 Finke. Spent 11 nights bush camping with campfires and only 1 night in a donga with only 2 showers! So, getting very used to climbing the ladder!!

## **NEWSLETTER # 2 CANNING STOCK ROUTE EXPEDITION JULY 2018**

### **STAGE 2 Alice Springs to Halls Creek -TANAMI TRACK**

Graham & I, Neville & Chris arrived in Alice Springs nearly a week early and found accommodation at the Good Day Mate Caravan Park. We spent most of our days relaxing and shopping for last minute items. Mick & Bev arrived early too and took the time to rest up.

**Day 1** – Tuesday 24th July we left Alice Springs for our journey up the Tanami Track to Halls Creek. The bitumen stayed with us until Tilmouth Well approx. 150 klms where we fuelled up and bought pies for lunch. The countryside is constantly changing as we run parallel with the range out to the south, grasslands and rocky outcrops. Sighted a number of wedge tail eagles feeding on road kill and also a feral cat! Also sighted 7 or 8 camels just west of Tilmouth Well.

There is a new gas pipeline running westward along the north side of the Tanami. The road is in excellent condition and we encountered many sections of road works and at one stage 3 graders were smoothing out the corrugations. We found a campsite north of Chilla Well far enough off the road to avoid the dust. The night is very warm and we cooked on a small campfire.

**Day 2** – Wednesday 25th July we woke to a beautiful sunrise. Packed up and ready to roll at 8.45am. We played 'leap frog' with two empty road trains which were travelling west slowly over the corrugations. The country side changes constantly from spinifex plains, rocky outcrops, wooded sections and lower areas littered with ant hills. The turnoff to Rabbit Flat has been blocked off now that it is closed and there is no access.

We lunched on the WA border and camped on the dry Sturt's Creek near Billiluna. (Graham and I were last here in 2000 and had welcome showers from the then fast flowing creek). The creek meanders through white snappy gums with lush green canopies. The last water hole is fouled by the carcass of a dead horse which didn't deter a stallion and his herd coming down for their evening watering.

We have turned back our time pieces 1.5 hours to be on WA time. Happy Hour and 4.50pm sees the sun dipping quickly in the west. Enjoyed yet another campfire under the stars.

**Day 3** – Thursday 26th July on the road to the Halls Creek, Great Northern H/way junction is very rough. As we are airing up our tyres at the bitumen, Fiona and Dave drove past and called up on the UHF. We fuelled up at the Coles Service Station and then drove around to the caravan park to book in and catch up with Fiona & Dave, Jeanette & Allan and Robyn & Glenn. The showers were bliss! We all enjoyed a counter meal at the pub across the road before an early night.

## FWDV ASSISTANCE REQUEST

We have been made aware recently that there is still a need for volunteers to help with rebuilding fences in the Cobden region of Victoria who were affected by the fires earlier this year.

Ian Lucas from the Otway's 4x4 club has been working 6 days a week since Easter and has advised us that the job will run until November at the present rate.
